The former special-purpose landing strip of the German Democratic Republic was the largest military airfield in Europe from 1955 to 1994. The area had to be cleared up from ordnance, pollutants and waste before construction was able to start. Over 220,000 tons of waste had to be removed from the site in the preparation phase. Approximately 1.3 tons of ordnances were removed by the explosive ordnance disposal service. Due to the special size of the power plant and the politically predetermined tight schedule, more than 400 people had been working simultaneously on site, from which 300 people were employed directly from this region. 20 local partner companies are involved in this project.



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
